

Hot tub Rules & Instructions


Safety First

- Please check the temperature of the water in the hot tub before use. Maximum safe water temperature should be established by a medical practitioner, not to exceed 104 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Do not use or allow the hot tub to be used alone.
- Persons who have high blood pressure, skin sensitivities, or who might be pregnant are strongly urged not to use a hot tub. If in doubt, please consult with a physician prior to using the hot tub.
- Observe reasonable time limits to avoid nausea, dizziness and fainting. Should you experience any of these symptoms, carefully exit the hot tub immediately.
- Children under 6 years of age are not permitted in the hot tub.
- Do not use under the influence of drugs and or alcohol.
- Surrounding deck may be icy and slippery; use caution.

Other

- Cover the tub when not in use.
- Although the tub can be set to 104 degrees you will probably enjoy it for longer at around 102. We let our kids (7 and up) go in but keep it at around 100 degrees for them...just a suggestion.
- No soaps, oils, lotions or shampoo in or near the tub.
- Observe bath load, Maximum is 7 people.





Instructions

- Jets 1 may not shut off entirely; it does run on a cycle to keep the water clean. If you press the jets 1 button you can increase it to a higher setting. Pressing it again will either turn it off or reduce it to low.
- Jets 2 can be on low or high, push once or twice accordingly and again to shut off. There needs to be a lot of water (or a lot of bodies) to be able to run jets 2 on high.
- The Air Injectors button is for the big bubble action. Again there is low and high, push once or twice accordingly and again to shut off.
- The display will visually show you which jets/injectors are on. There is also a light inside the tub that can be on different brightness settings. The tub also has perimeter lights that definitely help for getting in and out. Please shut everything off as you exit. Thanks.
- The water will have been changed before your arrival and the chemicals balanced. It's always a good idea to continue to check the water. There are tester strips in the house and you should call us or Chris or Jeremy if you are concerned about the water and would like to add chemicals.

TROUBLE SHOOTING

Before you call about the hot tub....a couple of things to try.

- Economy Mode If the tub is in economy mode it will not heat up and none of the other functions will respond. You will see the "econ" on the screen and you will need to push the MODE button once to put the tub back in standard mode.
- Panel Locked If you see a padlock on the screen and the tub is not responding the panel has been accidentally locked. You can try the following sequence but it doesn't always respond on the first try: press, Function, Mode, Temp Down. If you try that a few times and the padlock remains, you may shut off the power at the outside circuit breaker. Flip the breaker and leave it off for one minute. When you flip the breaker back on the tub will do a little countdown and reset itself....you should be back in business.
